



Designing and delivering a new cohort professional development program



How one district partnered with SMART to create a unique and replicable live remote teacher training program

CHALLENGE

Prince William County Public Schools (PWCS), in Manassas, Virginia, is the 35th-largest school district in the nation. The district aims to provide every student with a world-class education and emphasizes the importance of authentic, meaningful, and innovative learning experiences. The 2020 pandemic's disruption of in-person learning sent teachers scrambling to find tools that supported remote and hybrid instruction. District instructional leaders realized that Lumio, (formerly SMART Learning Suite Online) was a perfect fit for remote and hybrid teaching; however, most of the district's teachers did not know about this cloud-based software. To address this challenge, the district partnered with SMART to create a new cohort professional development (PD) program. Although the district had previously used cohort learning models to build collaboration and community, this particular instance would be entirely virtual.

CHALLENGE

To design and deliver a new cohort professional development program that helped teachers integrate Lumio by SMART in order to increase student engagement and improve achievement

OUTCOME

Successful completion of the program by more than 70 teachers districtwide, all of whom gave the program a "Met" or "Exceeded Expectations" rating and felt equipped to train teachers at their schools

WHY SMART?

PWCS chose to work with SMART because of the high-quality professional development services SMART offers. Rather than using sit-and-get, presentation-style delivery techniques, SMART's PD Specialists provide interactive, immersive, and hands-on learning experiences for teachers, ensuring that what teachers learn in a session is immediately transferable to the classroom. During the program, teachers from across the district attended monthly live remote training sessions followed by question-and-answer coaching opportunities one to two weeks later. The district also used Canvas, its learning management system, to integrate self-paced professional learning and reflection activities. Canvas allowed teachers to take part in a community of learning, easily accessing resources, reviewing recorded sessions, and connecting with others in the program for support, idea-sharing, and feedback.


OUTCOME

More than 70 teachers from across the district completed the five-month program. Survey results showed that 100% of program participants found the program "Met" or "Exceeded Expectations," thought the program created an environment conducive to learning, and agreed that it helped them conceptualize and apply Lumio's features in a way that met student needs. Teachers who completed the program were also well-equipped to train other teachers at their individual schools, making integration of Lumio even more successful across the district.
